



AACI to MAI

Eligibility

For Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) members to be eligible to pursue the Appraisal Institute's (AI) MAI membership designation, the AIC member must:

- have an AACI designation
- be a Member in Good Standing with the Appraisal Institute of Canada; and
- apply and be admitted as a General Candidate of the Appraisal Institute.

Once an AACI Designated Member is admitted as a General Candidate of the Appraisal Institute, as specified above, he/she must satisfy the following requirements to become an MAI Designated Member of the Appraisal Institute:

Requirements

- 1. Within the first twelve (12) months after being admitted to the Appraisal Institute as a General Candidate, he/she must:
 - a. Attend Al's Business Practices and Ethics Course;
 - b. Complete the required Professional Appraisal Practice Standards course:
 - i. If an AACI Designated Member intends to practice within the United States, he/she must:
 - Complete the <u>15-Hour National Uniform Standards of Professional</u> <u>Appraisal Practice (USPAP)</u> Course, either in-classroom or by distance/self-directed learning, and pass the corresponding examination.
 - ii. If an AACI Designated Member intends to practice solely in Canada, he/she must:
 - 1. Complete the AIC's Canadian Uniform Standards of Appraisal Practice (CUSPAP) <u>one-day professional practice seminar</u>; and
 - 2. Certify that he or she practices solely in Canada and intends to practice solely in Canada.
- 2. The AACI Designated Member must hold, and submit proof of, a four-year undergraduate degree prior to taking the Comprehensive Examination for the MAI Designation.*
- 3. The AACI Designated Member must pass the <u>Comprehensive Examination for the MAI</u> <u>designation.</u> (link)
- 4. The AACI Designated Member must complete the <u>MAI Membership Application</u> (a good moral character investigation may be required).

* If the AACI Designated Member does not hold such degree, he or she shall contact the Appraisal Institute Admissions Department regarding this requirement.





MAI to AACI

Eligibility

For Appraisal Institute (AI) members to be eligible to pursue the Appraisal Institute of Canada's (AIC) Accredited Appraiser Canada Institute (AACI) designation, the AI member must:

- hold the MAI Designation;
- be a Designated Member in Good Standing of the Appraisal Institute; and
- apply and be admitted as a Candidate Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada.

Once an MAI Designated Member is admitted as a Candidate Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada, as specified above, he/she must satisfy the following requirements to become an AACI Designated Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada.

Requirements

- 1. Within the first twelve (12) months after being accepted as a Candidate Member of the AIC, he/she must complete the required Professional Appraisal Practice Standards course:
 - i. If an MAI members intends to practice within Canada:
 - He/she must complete the AIC's <u>New Candidate Professional</u> <u>Practice Seminar (PPS)</u>, either in-classroom or by distance learning (including written exam).
 - ii. If an MAI member intends to practice solely in the United States, he/she must:
 - Complete the <u>15-Hour National Uniform Standards of Professional</u> <u>Appraisal Practice (USPAP)</u> Course, either in-classroom or by distance learning, and pass the corresponding examination; and
 - 2. Certify that he or she practices solely in the United States and intends to practice solely in the United States.
- 2. The MAI Designated Member must successfully complete the Applied Experience Written Exam.
- 3. The MAI Designated Member must complete the Professional Competency Interview.
- 4. The MAI Designated Member must hold a four-year college undergraduate degree. *
- 5. The MAI Designated Member must complete the AIC Membership Application.

*If an MAI Designated Member does not hold such degree, he or she shall contact the Appraisal Institute of Canada's Admissions Department regarding this requirement.



CRA to SRA

<u>Eligibility</u>

For Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) members to be eligible to pursue the Appraisal Institute's (AI) SRA membership designation, the AIC member must:

- have a CRA designation
- be a Member in Good Standing with the Appraisal Institute of Canada; and
- apply and be admitted as a Residential Candidate of the Appraisal Institute.

Once a CRA Designated Member is admitted as a Residential Candidate of the Appraisal Institute, he/she must satisfy the following requirements to become an SRA member of the Appraisal Institute.

Requirements

- 1. Within the first twelve (12) months after being admitted to the Appraisal Institute as a Residential Candidate, the CRA Designated Member must:
 - a. Attend Al's Business Practices and Ethics Course ;
 - b. Complete the required Professional Appraisal Practice Standards course:
 - i. If a CRA Designated Member intends to practice within the United States, he/she must:
 - Complete the <u>15-Hour National Uniform Standards of Professional</u> <u>Appraisal Practice (USPAP)</u> Course, either in-classroom or by distance/self-directed learning, and pass the corresponding examination.
 - ii. If a CRA Designated Member intends to practice solely in Canada, he/she must:
 - Complete the AIC's Canadian Uniform Standards of Appraisal Practice (CUSPAP) <u>one-day professional practice seminar</u>; and
 - Certify that he or she practices solely in Canada and intends to practice solely in Canada.
- 2. The CRA Designated Member must hold, and submit proof of, a four-year undergraduate college degree prior to taking the Comprehensive Examination for the SRA Designation.*
- 3. Complete the <u>SRA Membership Application</u> (a good moral character investigation may be required).

*If the CRA Designated Member does not hold such degree, he or she shall contact the Appraisal Institute Admissions Department about this requirement.



SRA to CRA

<u>Eligibility</u>

For Appraisal Institute (AI) members to be eligible to pursue the Appraisal Institute of Canada's (AIC) Canadian Residential Appraiser (CRA) designation, the AI member must:

- hold the SRA Designation;
- be a Member in Good Standing with the Appraisal Institute; and
- apply and be admitted as a Candidate Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada.

Once an SRA member becomes a Candidate Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada as specified above, he/she must satisfy the following requirements to become a CRA Designated Member.

Requirements

- 1. Within the first twelve (12) months after being accepted as a Candidate Member of the AIC, he/she must complete the required Professional Appraisal Practice Standards course:
 - i. If an SRA member intends to practice within Canada, he/she must:
 - Complete the AIC's <u>New Candidate Professional Practice Seminar</u> (PPS), either in-classroom or by distance/self-directed learning (including written exam).
 - ii. If an SRA member intends to practice solely in the United States, he/she must:
 - Complete the <u>15-Hour National Uniform Standards of Professional</u> <u>Appraisal Practice (USPAP)</u> Course, either in-classroom or distance/self-directed learning, and pass the corresponding examination; and
 - 2. Certify that he or she intends to practice solely in the United States.
- 2. Successfully complete the Applied Experience Written Exam.
- 3. Complete the Professional Competency Interview.
- 4. Complete the AIC Membership Application.
