





THE KEITH GOODWIN AWARD

The British Columbia Association of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC-BC) is pleased to announce that it will present this **award for outstanding achievement in accordance with each year's Annual General Meeting.** The award is intended to recognize a designated member for outstanding service, leadership, achievement, education, or mentoring. The award is named after Appraisal Institute of Canada (AIC) past Provincial and National President, Keith Goodwin, who personifies these attributes.

Keith Goodwin commenced his professional career in England in 1973 and moved to Canada in 1980. He joined AIC in 1987 and is now a Retired Fellow and Accredited Member of the Appraisal Institute of Canada (P.App, AACI, Fel.). Mr. Goodwin served on the National Governing Council and the Executive Committee and was also a member of the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors (MRICS), Real Estate Institute of British Columbia (REIBC), B.C. Housing Commissioner, and President of the Skeena Kalum Society. He was elected as AIC-BC President in 1994-1995 and AIC National President in 2002-2003.

The AIC-BC Nominating Committee will solicit written nominations from the membership by the end of August in each calendar year. The AIC-BC Provincial Board of Directors will then determine the recipient of the award for the year.

The **Keith Goodwin Award** is to be presented when warranted to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to the appraisal profession or has distinguished themselves in assisting the professional aims of the AIC-BC and AIC. Since this is a Provincial award, priority will be given to those individuals whose contributions have been made at the Provincial/Chapter level. Outstanding contribution could include:

- Consistent involvement, including leadership, in professional association activities.
- Demonstrated sustained professional excellence.
- Contributed to knowledge through publication, presentation, and research.
- Demonstrated ongoing commitment to educating members and the public.
- Creative or innovative contributions that advance or stimulate the future of the profession.

Note: Current members of the AIC-BC Board are not eligible for nomination. Award selection will be made in accordance with AIC-BC policy.

Presentation/Announcement:

- The Goodwin Award will be presented at the AIC-BC Annual General Meeting.
- An article on the recipient will go into the AIC-BC WestCoast Appraiser and AIC-BC Provincial website with biography and pictures.

Nominations must include a biography (one page minimum) detailing contributions performed by the Member being nominated. Nominations should be addressed to the AIC-BC Nominating Committee and must be submitted no later than August 31st, 2023.
