INTERNATIONAL PATHS TO THE AACI DESIGNATION - POLICY

RICS Recognition (FRICS, MRICS)

Individuals applying for AACI designation who have earned a designation through traditional education (*), experience and exam requirements with the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors (RICS) and belong to their Valuation Faculty (Commercial Property Pathway if they meet the Valuation Pathway competency levels) are required to successfully complete the requirements, as defined in the International Paths to the AACI Designation table Path “A” - see table.

It is to be noted that these members have two years to complete the requirements.

(*) Means accredited degree and excludes those who have received their designation through other reciprocal agreements (international or otherwise) or equivalencies.

API, PINZ, SISV Recognition

Individuals applying for AACI designation who are members in good standing of the following Associations*:

- Australian Property Institute (API) – Associate or Fellow Member
- Property Institute of New Zealand (PINZ)- Senior or Fellow Member or member (ANZIV or FNZIV) of NZIV
- Singapore Institute of Surveyors and Valuers (SISV) – Member (MSISV) or Fellow (FSISV) belonging to Valuation and General Practice Division

Will be required to successfully complete the requirements, as defined in the International Paths to the AACI Designation table Path “A” – see table.

It is to be noted that these members have two years to complete the requirements.

* Excludes those who have received their designation through other reciprocal agreements (international or otherwise) or equivalencies.

Other International Valuation Designations

Will be required to successfully complete the requirements, as defined in the International Paths to the AACI Designation table Path “B” - see table.

No or Incomplete Valuation Designations

Will be required to successfully complete the requirements, as defined in the International Paths to the AACI Designation table Path “C” – see table.
